LTHS TIPS

1. Take some time to go through the LTHS website
2. Sign up for the RSS feeds to be delivered to your email
3. Sign up for various enewletters
4. When trying to contact staff, try email first with your student's name in the subject line
5. Sign up for Parent Connect for grades and set an email prompt for grades and attendance notifications
6. Sign up with the cafeteria to pay online and set up email prompts for low balances
7. The first time you go to the school take your driver's license and get set up in the system
8. You will need to sign in and out at the front office every time you go on campus during the school day
9. Attend all school informative meetings – such as scheduling info in Jan/Feb, Open House in September.
10. Read over the information your child brings home after the first day. The teachers line out all the information needed for each class and expectations.
11. Check out the websites for your child's teachers.
12. If you are new to Texas schools, attend the new to the district informational session, check out the counseling website for the course catalog and college prep handbook for excellent information. If you still have questions, email your student's assigned counselor.
13. Driver's permits and Driving to school- Check out Texas DPS website for correct procedures. A VOE (verification of education) is required for a permit and yearly renewals until age 18. These are requested by the student in the front office. Allow at least 24 hours for turn around. They expire in 30 days. A parking permit is required on campus and students will need a copy of insurance to obtain. – some driver's testing locations are open late one night – when going from permit to license – go that night and get all paperwork completed, then show up 1 hour before opening another day to take the driver's test. This decreases the amount of school missed.
14. Mid term and final test exemptions- watch the LTHS website a couple of weeks before exam time, they will publish information on exemptions.

Insider tips for newbie Cavaliers

(for students - by students)

- 1) if you're not in shape... You will be. The campus is pretty big – and spread out - so be prepared for a hike from class to class. Walk fast the first days, and don't worry, it gets easier.
- 2) and your shoulders should be strong, too. Lockers are available, but at LTHS, most students just carry ginormous backpacks filled to the brim. Again, it gets easier - and you'll figure out your best strategy. Since we have A days and B days, you might want to go with the 2 different bag program One set up for each day. [Most of us just deal with it.]
- 3) Early birds get the worm here. With teachers, that is. Almost every teacher has tutorials before school - and they are SUPER helpful, especially around test time. Set your alarm & get there early - you'll be glad at report card time you did.
- 4) Consider 'brown bagging' it the first couple days of school. The line is super long & busy, & the time you get thru, lunch will be over & you'll still be hungry.
- 5) Yes, actually football is even bigger than you've heard. The Drive for Five is part of the culture at LTHS, so make plans to check out all the pep rallies & home games for sure. All sports are big here, so if you're into it, find your favorite and check it out. Our new website is a great place to start.
- 6) but if athletics isn't your thing, that's ok too. There's something for everyone at LTHS. Check out all the other activities and service project opportunities available here.
- 7) If you think that test two weeks away isn't ready to be studied for, um, think again. It doesn't hurt to start studying early - that way you can remember things easily once the day comes. Academics are serious business too, here at LTHS, but if you commit to prepping early, you'll be super happy once the test rolls around.
- 8) Stay organized and pay attention to deadlines & calendars. The A and B day setup can make it complicated at first - so beat the system by over organizing yourself at first. Don't just stuff assignments in to your backpacks or binders randomly. Make tabs for your binders, especially a homework tab. No one likes digging through their bag in search for lost homework, or worse yet, forgetting an assignment completely.
- 9) Don't stress out too much, it just ends up making things more difficult and harder to focus on what's important.
- 10) Smile, you just might make someone's day!
